11-199 Medical Services-Juvenile Detention

1. How many juveniles are in the facility on average?
The average daily population is 10-12
2. How often is the current physician on site?
There is no current physician. The MO SC rules mandate each resident receive a physical/medical screening within five days of admission
3. How often is the current NP on site?
See answer above
4. When you ask for past contracts awarded for medical care, do you want juvenile and adult facilities?
I would suggest juvenile facilities, but if none, than adult
5. The bid form does not contain an hourly cost for the nurse. Is that information to be provided also?
There is no current service and hourly cost. The cost will certainly influence the selection.
6. Is the NP position a replacement for the Nurse?
There is currently no NP or Nurse
7. Who is responsible for the cost of pharmaceuticals?
All kids in detention are immediately referred for Medicaid
8. What time and location(s) is sick call currently conducted?
There is no "sick call". The kids are taken outside the facility for medical Attention when warranted
9. How many physicals are performed each week?
Presently there are no physicals conducted at the facility
10. Does the County TB test juveniles?
There is currently no regular testing for TB in the facility
11. Is the detention center currently subject to any court orders or legal directives?
The center is subject to MO Statute (Chapter 210 & 211) and MO Supreme Court Rules/Standards (#123 & 129.04)
12. Is there a dedicated fax line to medical?
Yes
13. Is there internet service available in the medical unit?
Internet service is available in the Center but the availability in the Nurse's Office would need to be discussed.
