PORTAGE ROAD CLOSURE BETWEEN REES AND WEBER LAKE CONTINUES

ST. CHARLES COUNTY, MO – NuStar Energy, L.P., and Blackburn Construction, in cooperation with TraMar Contracting, are extending the closure of Portage Road between Rees Road and Weber Lake Road to allow for a pipeline replacement. The closure began Sept. 1 and is now expected to last at least to the end of the month. The companies have made the proper notifications to the St. Charles County Highway Department.

Traffic will be required to use a detour route around the closure while the pipeline is replaced. Local traffic can access either side of the closure location, but no through traffic will be permitted. Signs notifying motorists of the closure and the necessary detours will be posted.
