ST. CHARLES COUNTY ASSESSOR TO MAIL PERSONAL PROPERTY NOTICES OF ASSESSMENT CHANGE

ST. CHARLES COUNTY, MO – The St. Charles County Assessor is mailing approximately 39,000 Personal Property Notices of Assessment Change on June 6. Taxpayers who reported additional personal property or made corrections to their 2023 personal property assessments will receive the notice. The mailing is part of County Assessor Scott Shipman’s efforts to further involve residents and make the assessment process less burdensome.

“Our intention is to help taxpayers better understand their assessments and address their concerns before tax bills are received at the end of the year,” says Shipman. “Providing this information mid-year gives taxpayers time to appeal the value within the statutory timeframe if they choose.”
