Carter Pleads Guilty in School Assault Case

St. Charles County, Missouri- The Office of Prosecuting Attorney Tim Lohmar announces that Jordin Casey Carter entered a guilty plea in court today. Carter will spend 5 years on probation for the felony charge of assault while on school property and 4 misdemeanor charges involving an assault on a law enforcement officer, interfering with and resisting arrest, as well as stalking.

On April 26, 2013, Carter and an accomplice attacked a classmate at Francis Howell High School. The classmate was kicked, punched, and sustained a broken nose in the attack. The victim had been targeted by Carter and the accomplice before this incident occurred. During Carter's arrest, she assaulted the arresting officer and interfered with another student's arrest. Carter's accomplice was referred to juvenile authorities.

On January 24, Carter entered her guilty plea before the Hon. Judge Nancy Schneider. In addition to 5 years on probation, Carter will have to undergo a psychological evaluation and treatment, an anger management course, go on a prison tour, and must pay restitution to and have no contact with the victim.
