Davis Found Guilty in Assault on Law Enforcement Officer

St. Charles County, Missouri - THE OFFICE OF PROSECUTING ATTORNEY TIM LOHMAR ANNOUNCES that, after deliberating into the early morning hours of Saturday September 14th, 2013 a St. Charles County jury found Scott M. Davis, Jr. guilty as charged of Assault 1st Degree, Armed Criminal Action and Assault 1st Degree on a Law Enforcement Officer.

The jury heard evidence that on April 18, 2012, in the 7900 block of Oakbark Court in O'Fallon, the defendant, under the influence of an illegal narcotic, struck a female acquaintance repeatedly in the head and face with a wooden club with metal spikes at the top and struck her body with a golf club. The defendant caused lacerations and fractures to the female victim.

When an O'Fallon Police Officer arrived on scene he found the defendant standing naked in the front lawn of a residence. While attempting to take the defendant into custody, the defendant refused to follow the orders of the officer and struck the officer repeatedly with his hands and fists. The defendant proceeded to choke the officer and attempted to take his duty pistol. The officer initially attempted to taser the defendant, but was unsuccessful. Fearing for his life, the officer fired at the defendant. Three additional officers arrived on scene and after tasing the defendant twice were able to physically take the defendant into custody.
