



Riverside Landing Camping Rules

- Camping is allowed in designated areas only. Sites marked reserved are occupied.
- Guests must be 18 years of age to reserve a campsite and be present during their stay.
- Check-in is at 3 p.m. and check-out at noon.
- All vehicles, including trailers are restricted to designated roads and parking areas.
- All pets must be kept on a leash. Owners are responsible for keeping their pets reasonably quiet, supervised and under control of the owner at all times. Owners are responsible for picking up after their pet.
- Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 6 a.m. Music permitted, but may not exceed 75 decibels per County Ordinance.
- No glass containers allowed in any St. Charles County Park per County Ordinance.
- Hunting, discharging of firearms, and other weapons are prohibited.
- Fireworks are prohibited.
- Fishing is allowed, but guests must comply with state laws and license requirements as established by the Missouri Department of Conservation.
- St. Charles County Parks is not responsible for damage or theft of personal property.
- Campfires are not allowed.
- Camping is limited to 14 consecutive days within a 30-day period per County Ordinance.
- Campsites must be free of debris and trash before departing.
- User of fryers are not permitted anywhere in St. Charles County Parks.
- Propane cylinders are limited to 40 lbs or less.
- Soliciting donations or contributions and advertising or selling any good or service is prohibited.
